Groceries Prices in United States are 54.50% <b>higher</b> than in Mexico
Rent Prices in Miami, FL are 255.77% <b>higher</b> than in Puerto Vallarta
Restaurant Prices in Miami, FL are 141.84% <b>higher</b> than in Puerto Vallarta
Groceries Prices in Miami, FL are 119.69% <b>higher</b> than in Puerto Vallarta
